- Union Cemetery. Earliest stone is memorial for three men killed during Manannah Massacre (Sioux Uprising of 1862). Marble slab marks the grave of the fourth victim of Manannah Massacre.
- Manannah Massacre (Monument). Eleven men who sought refuge at Forest City returned to their homesteads for provisions and on their return to Forest City were ambushed (August 26, 1862). Four men were killed.
- Forest City Stockade. Originally constructed on September 3, 1862. It furnished security to hundreds of Meeker County citizens during the Sioux uprising of 1862. As part of our nation's Bicentennial, residents of Meeker County rebuilt the stockade in its entirety.
- Grove Mill (Grove City). Historic former windmill. Contains small museum.
- Acton Incident (Sunday, August 17, 1862). Largest Indian war to take place in United States. Sioux Uprising of 1862 began at this location. Large stone monument is erected where the incident happened. Five men were killed.
- Andreas Olson (Marker). Killed by Sioux Indians (August 22, 1862).
- New Lutheran Church. Victims of Acton Incident are buried in a common grave at New Church (built in 1874).
- Nelson Farm. 3 miles southwest of Litchfield.
- World's largest Twine Ball (Darwin).
- Old Depot Museum (Dassel). Old Great Northern Depot built in 1913.
- Daniel Crow (Marker). Killed by Sioux Indians (September 20, 1863).
- Kalob Sankon (Marker). Killed by Sioux Indians (September 19, 1863).
- Chief Little Crow (Monument). Chanyay and Nathan Lamson encountered famous Sioux Indian Chief Little Crow at this site. After exchange of shots, Chief Little Crow lay dead and Nathan Lamson wounded (July 3, 1863).
- Frontier Era Trade Goods (Cosmos). Lettau Taxidermy.
